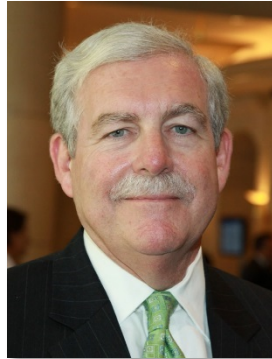

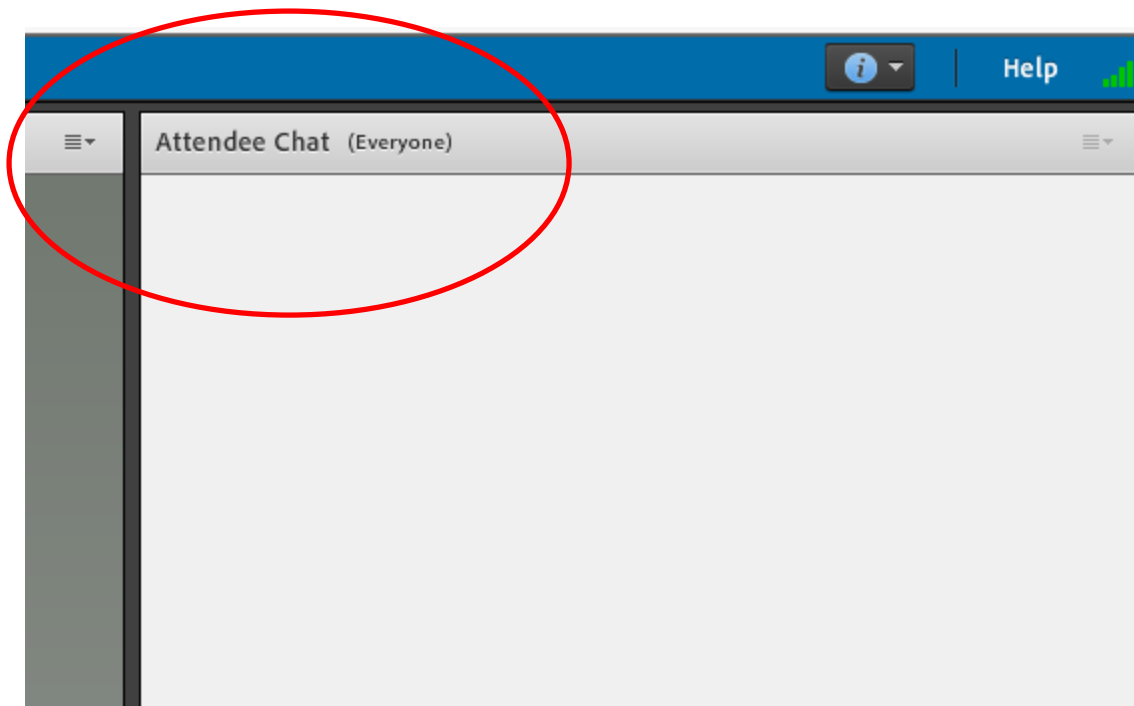

Government Data Landscape



Data stored across multiple systems from multiple agencies in multiple formats



Data quality issues: dirty and messy



Lack of standards, consistency



Data sharing is difficult: format, language, access, culture, myths



Security concerns and privacy issues



Little insightful, usable data on "customers"

2016 NASCIO Federal Advocacy



Congress should work with state CIOs to include and enhance cross-boundary collaboration in legislative proposals



Congress should ensure appropriate funding to enable information sharing and exchange is authorized in legislative proposals

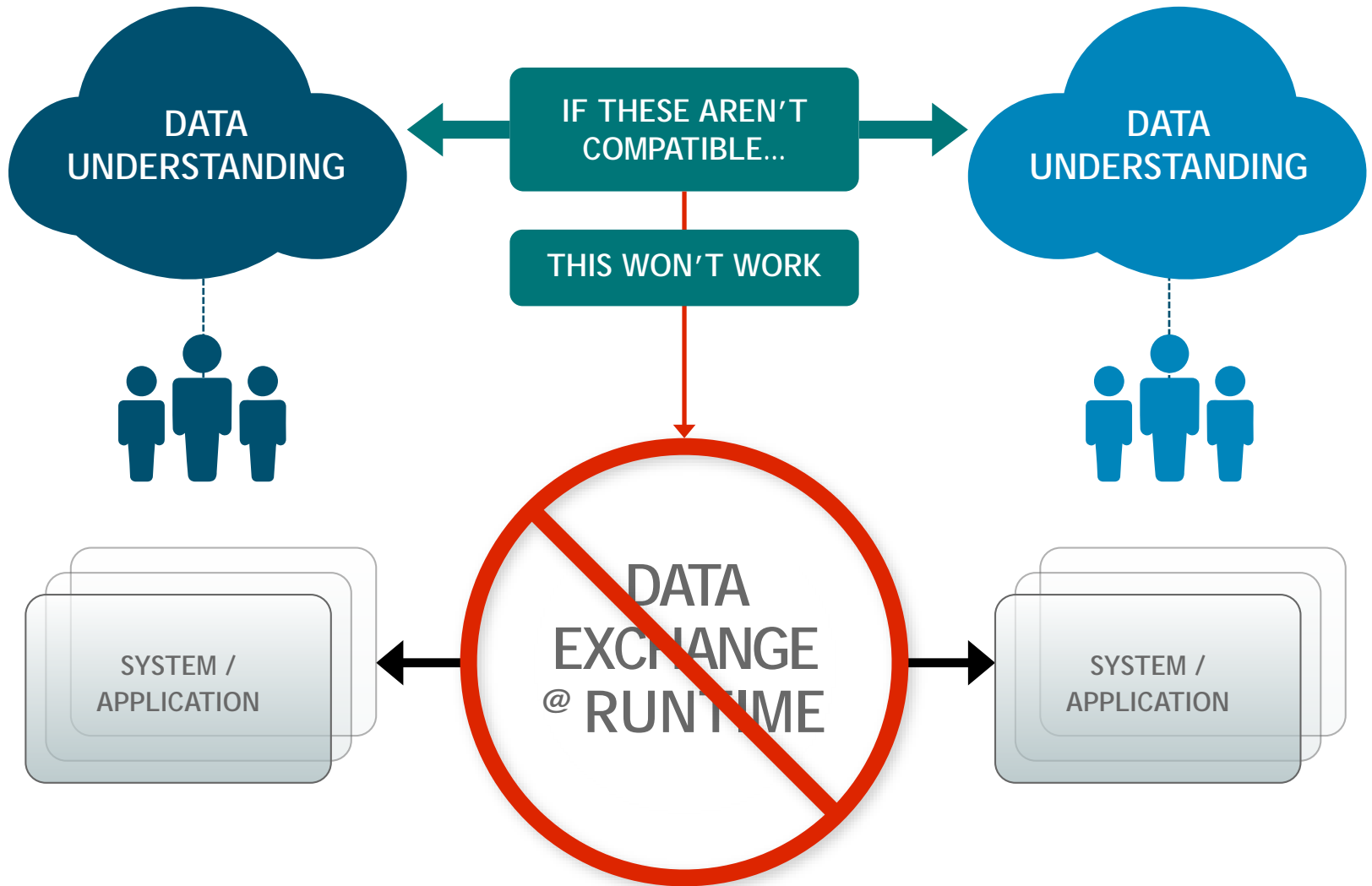


What is NIEM?

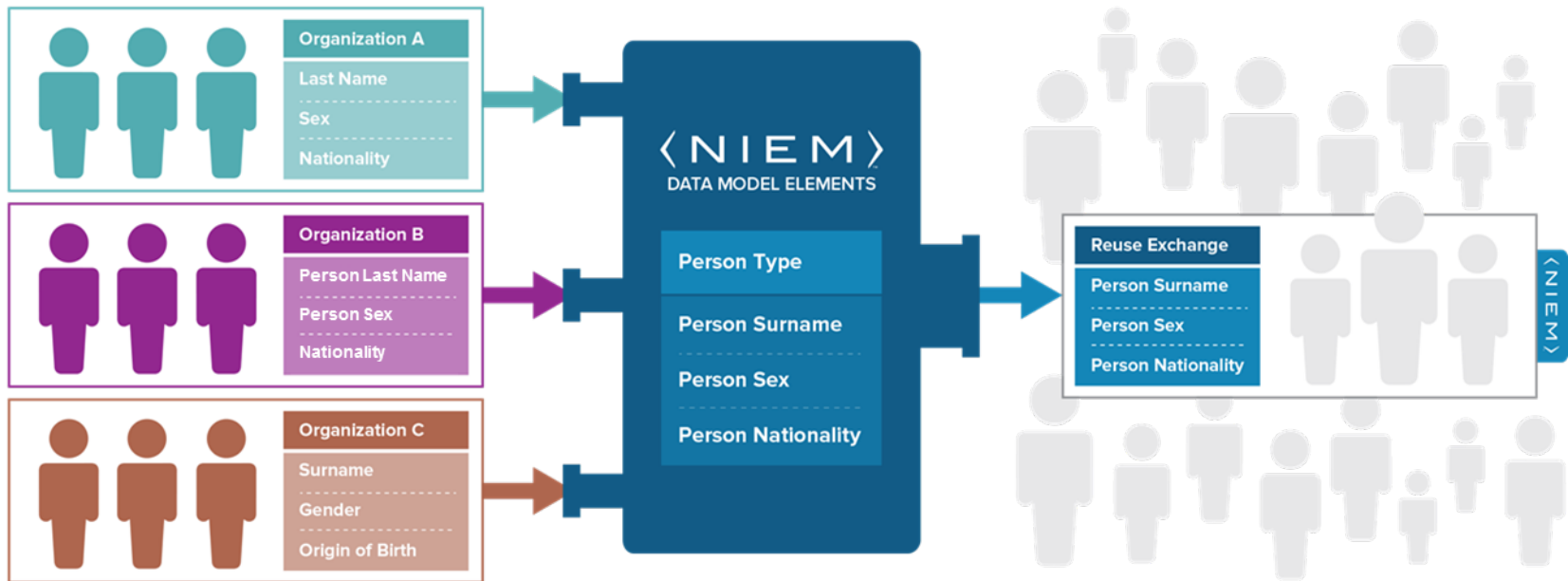
NIEM is a common vocabulary that enables efficient information exchange across diverse public and private organizations.

NIEM can save time and money by providing consistent, reusable data terms and definitions and repeatable processes.

Data Interoperability Problem



How NIEM Helps Form the Foundation for Data Exchange

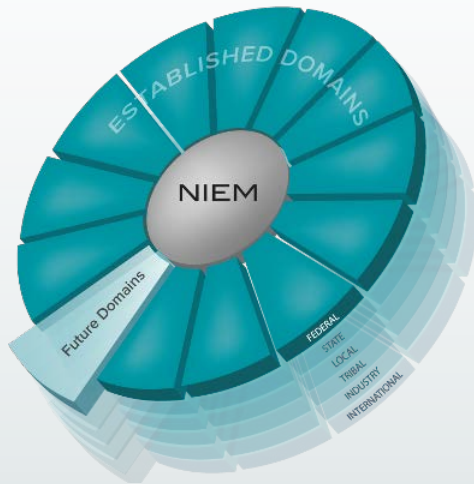


Using NIEM, organizations can come together to agree on a common vocabulary. When additional organizations need to be added to the information exchange, the initial NIEM exchange can be reused, saving time and money.

The Big Picture: How NIEM Works

Think of the NIEM data model as a mature and stable data dictionary of agreed-upon terms, definitions, relationships and formats—-independent of how information is stored in individual agency systems.

Common Vocabulary (Community-driven Data Model)



Built and governed by the business users at Federal, State, Local, Tribal, International and Private Sectors

Repeatable, Reusable Process (Information Exchange Development Lifecycle)



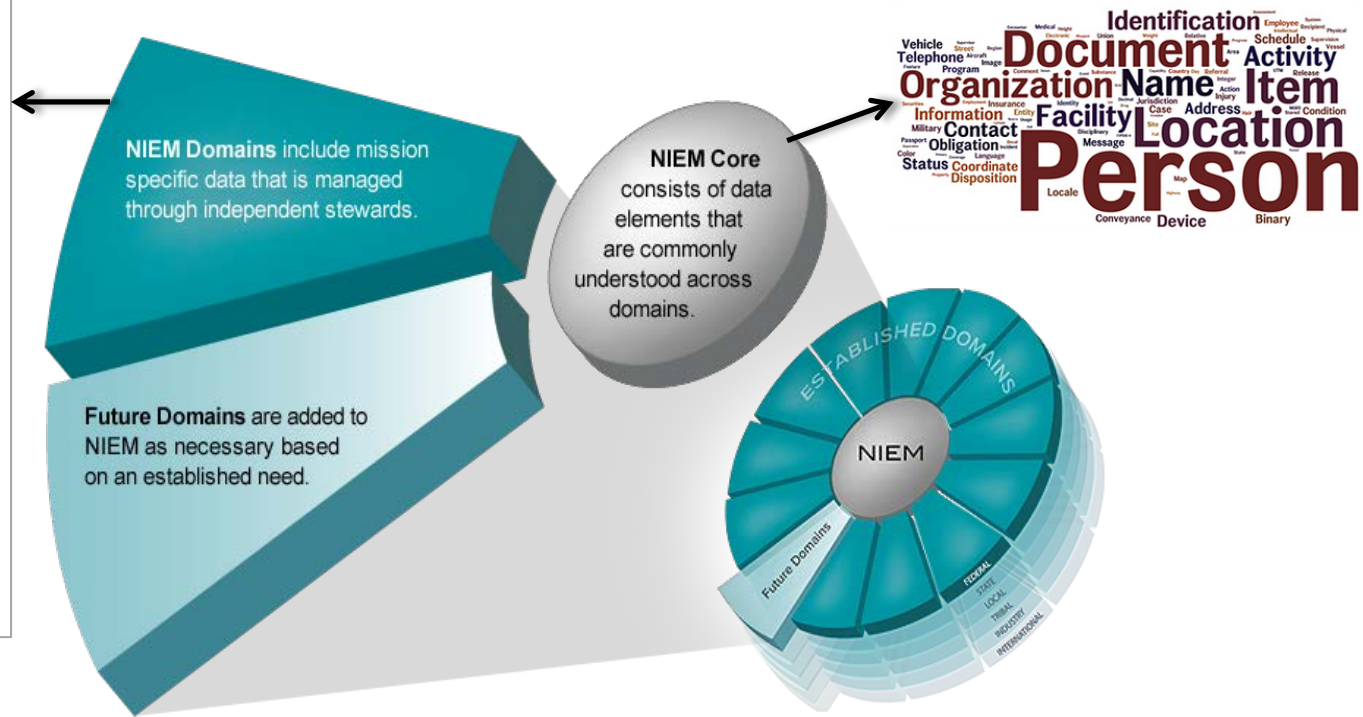
NIEM enables organizations to move information across organizational boundaries in order to interoperate and act as one, while maintaining authority of their own existing systems.

Model Overview

The NIEM model itself is currently available in XSD and Microsoft Excel formats, where XSD is the authoritative representation. You can also use the NIEM model with Unified Modeling Language (UML) tools to graphically depict exchanges and the elements of each exchange message.

The NIEM data model consists of two sets of closely related vocabularies: **NIEM Core** and individual **NIEM Domains**.

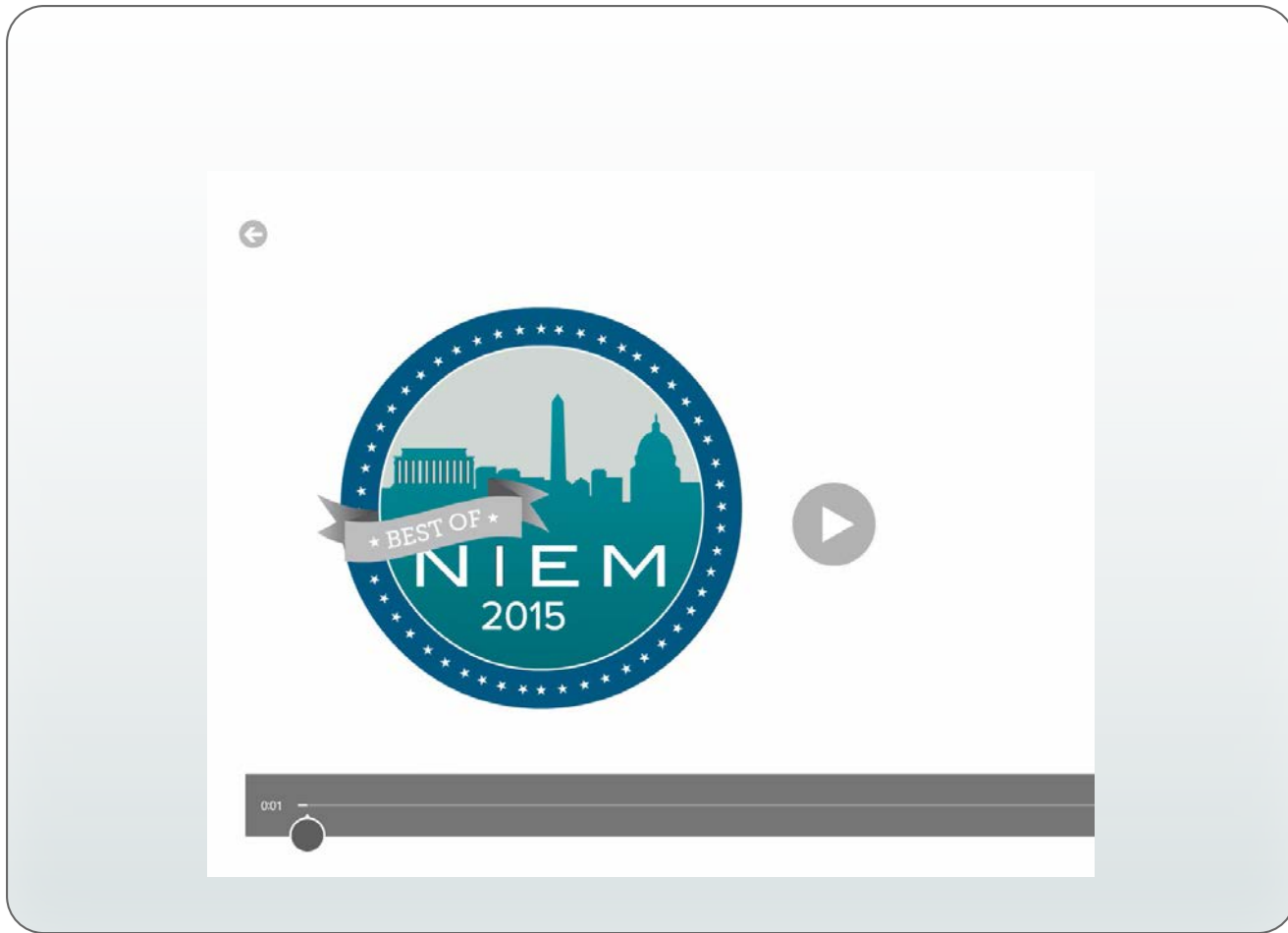

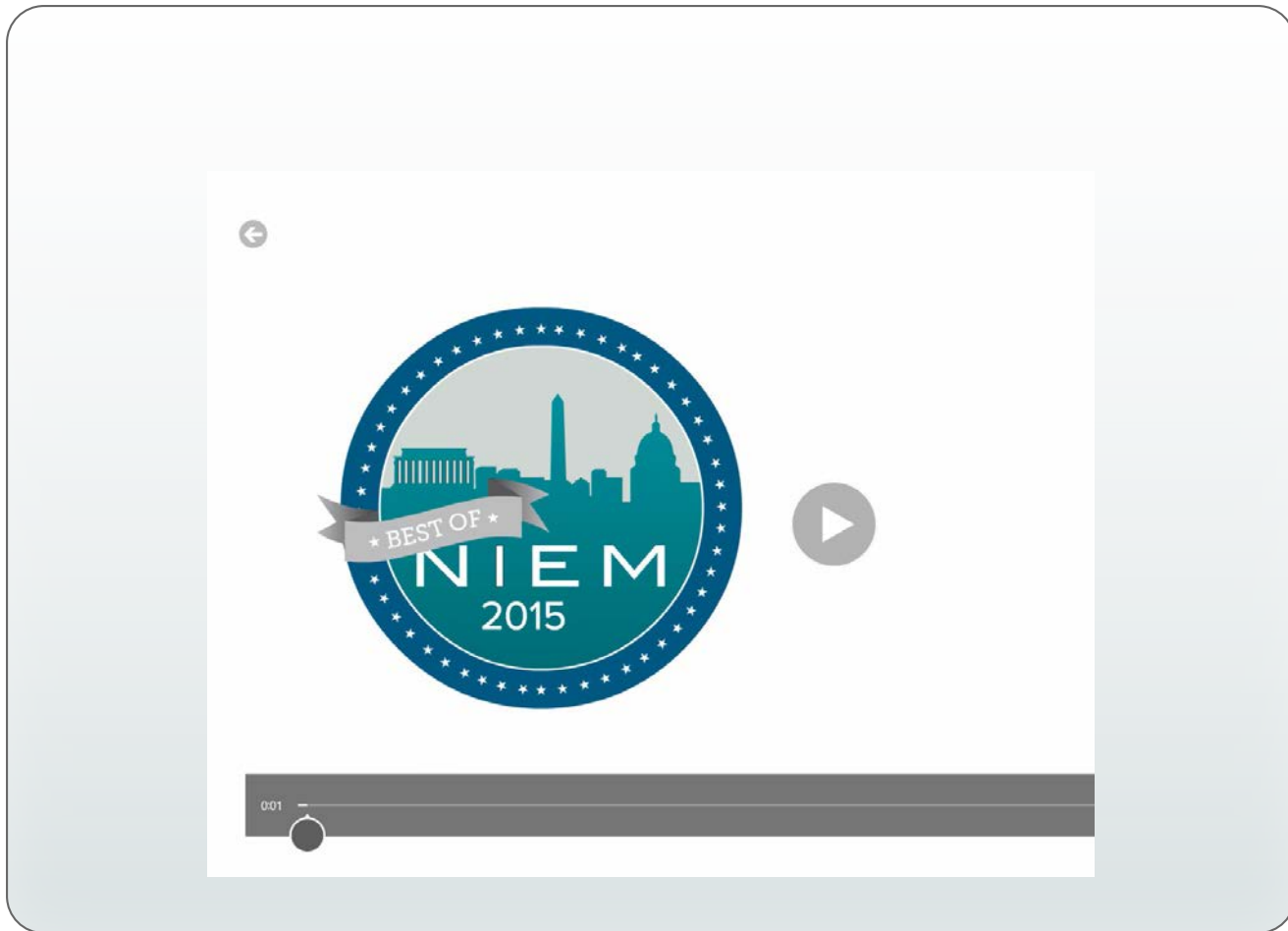
