
Cisco coined the term Internet of Everything in 2013 and later expanded it to the Internet of Things. While IoT focuses on the connectivity between devices, IoE encompasses a broader scope, including devices, people, processes and data — all interconnected to create more intelligent and responsive systems. A decade later, embracing the term Artificial Intelligence of Everything, or AloE, seems appropriate, a significant evolutionary phenomenon.


IoE emphasizes how all of these interconnected elements — people, processes, data and things — interact to create new experiences, efficiencies and business models through connectivity. By comparison, AloE extends the IoE concept by adding a layer of artificial intelligence across everything connected. It implies




# Are you confident that your local government's current technology workforce has the expertise to fill key roles and skillsets with the advent of GenAI?




